Council sets deaf, deaf-blind meeting

LANSING – The Michigan Division on Deaf and Hard of Hearing Advisory Council will meet on Dec. 2, 2011.

The meeting, which will be open to the public, will be of interest to people who are deaf, hard of hearing, deaf-blind, their family members and professionals interested in learning more about the division's work and mission.

The meeting will take place at the State Secondary Complex, General Office Building, located at 7150 Harris Drive, Dimondale, Michigan from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. There will be an opportunity for public comment at the concluding part of the meeting.

Sign language interpreters and communication access real-time translation (CART) will be provided. People with disabilities requiring additional accommodation services to participate in the meeting are asked to contact Christy Hill at 1-877-499-6232 at least two business days before the meeting.

Individuals intending to attend the meeting are asked to refrain from using heavily scented personal care products to enhance accessibility for everyone.

Lunch will be provided for **only** the DODHH advisory board members and invited guests. However, there is a full-service grill and cafeteria located next to the conference room. It will accept only cash or checks for payment.

The Division on Deaf and Hard of Hearing is under the Michigan Department of Civil Rights.

## CAPA Scholars Award 2012 – Update

A diverse group of ten students from nine different area schools attended the CAPA Scholars Award interviews on November 9<sup>th</sup>. ### **Remember the problems of people with disabilities during inclement weather**

DETROIT — On the eve of the first predicted snowfall in many parts of the state, the Michigan Department of Civil Rights (MDCR) asks Michiganders to remember the well-being of people with disabilities.

Deep heavy snow and other blockages to curb cuts and disability parking spaces create precarious conditions for people with limited mobility. "Please think of people using wheelchairs, motorized scooters, canes and walkers and how they are challenged by icy ramps, snow-covered curb cuts and accessible parking spaces filled with plowed snow," MDCR said.

Adequate snow and ice removal is also wise from a legal standpoint.

MDCR warns that the Department of Civil Rights will investigate complaints about improper snow removal. The Michigan Persons With Disabilities Civil Rights Act states that "a person shall accommodate a person with a disability for purposes of employment, public accommodation, public service, education, or housing unless the person demonstrates that the accommodation would impose an undue hardship."

Clearing a path that is at least 40 inches in width helps accommodate people using wheelchairs.

Ice removal is encouraged for everyone's safety, and many mobility devices don't function well on slick or slushy surfaces.

### **GREEN CARD OBTAINED IN LESS THAN 2 MINUTES**

A Filipino-American lawyer might have recorded the fastest time to obtain a green card – "less than two minutes."

Legal counsel Arnedo Valera appears to have broken the record set by another Filipino-American lawyer, the late Renato L. Amponin, who had reported that he once handled an immigration case of a Filipina criminal-case witness, who obtained "within hours" a green card, a document that allows a foreigner to obtain permanent-resident status in the United States.

Valera said that his client, Susan Hinaut, was issued a green card "in less than two minutes" by an immigration officer in Long Island, New York when the officer found out that she needed to go home to the Philippines to bury her son the day before her scheduled interview.

Valera said that during the interview, the officer "offered her condolences to Susan and remarked she must go home right away. Children are supposed to bury their parents, not the parents burying their children. I will issue your green card right away," Ms. Hinaut was quoted as saying by Mariver R. Montebon, managing editor of *Migrant Heritage Chronicle*.

The officer's remark left Ms. Hinaut dumbfounded and in tears, saying, "I

couldn't believe it. I thanked the officer endlessly and I cried." She was not interviewed any further.

"No one really knows one's fate when one enters into the immigration office to apply for permanent residency status. But Susan is just one of those so lucky enough to be approved quickly." Valera said. "This is a random act of kindness that does not happen all the time." (Filipino Star News)
