**Call for Applications:  
2013 Scholar Awards Provided by the Council of Asian Pacific Americans (CAPA)**

The Council of Asian Pacific Americans (CAPA) is pleased to announce a call for applications for its 2013 Scholar Awards. This prestigious award was established by CAPA to encourage the educational advancement of APA youth in Michigan and to foster youth involvement and leadership in the APA Community.

The 2013 Scholar Awards are intended for full-time high school seniors who will attend an institution of higher education in the State of Michigan and who will continue to reside in Michigan. Eligible candidates must have an Asian Pacific American (APA) heritage and should be willing to serve on CAPA's Youth Committee to give back to the APA community. This year, CAPA will issue \$1,000 Scholar Awards to two selected high school seniors. The two recipients will be chosen by CAPA's Education Committee, which will base its selection upon the applicants' potential to provide outstanding APA leadership and/or community service in Michigan.
